Sheridan offers full-time, English as a Second Language (ESL) classes. We offer five levels:

- Foundation
- Pre-intermediate
- Intermediate
- Advanced
- English for Academic Purposes (EAP)

Students will be placed in the appropriate level based on their choice of TOEFL, IELTS or Sheridan's on-campus placement test. Successful EAP graduates can apply to other programs at Sheridan with no further testing required.

EAP (ENGLISH FOR ACADEMIC PURPOSES) AWARD

International students who complete Sheridan's EAP program with high academic achievement and continue into one of Sheridan's full-time programs are eligible to receive an EAP Award.

EAP Award of **\$500** if continuing into our certificate, diploma and post-graduate programs.

EAP Award of **\$1,000** if continuing into our degree programs. Joint degree programs with other universities are not eligible for this award.
