





TRANSFER IN

If you have completed a similar course at another recognized postsecondary institution, you may be eligible to receive transfer credits toward your Humber program.

TRANSFER WITHIN

Humber supports continuous learning and we have many pathways between credentials to help you find the right program fit.

Students who enroll in our diploma programs can transfer into our degree programs and receive partial credit for their previous studies. Please note that a reduction in the length of a study program could influence the length of a student's postgraduate work permit.

TRANSFER OUT

Humber graduates can continue their study pathways at other educational institutions internationally or within Canada.
