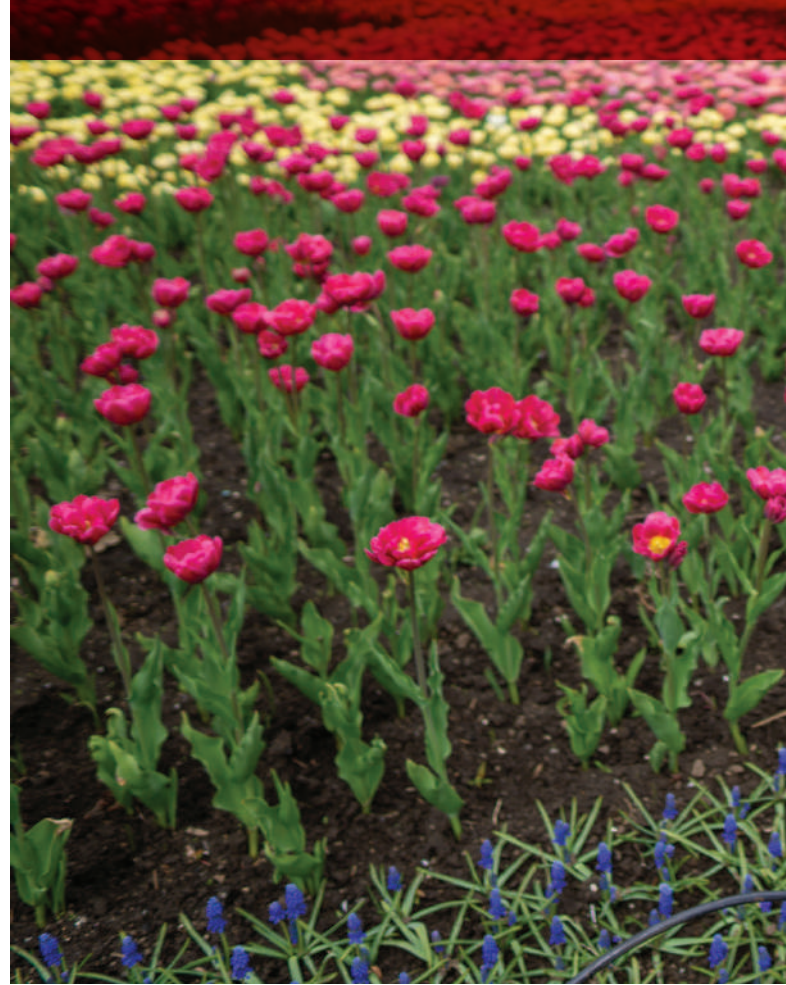

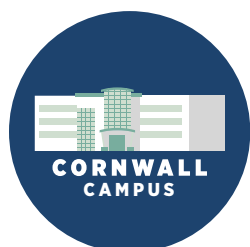

ESL PRE-ACADEMIC LEVEL 1: PRE-INTERMEDIATE

Focus on everyday topics and enhance listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills.

ESL PRE-ACADEMIC LEVEL 2: INTERMEDIATE

Build vocabulary and practice all skills in preparation for advanced level.

GAS – EAP LEVEL 3: ADVANCED

Increase academic vocabulary and practice all skills to prepare for academic programs. Upon successful completion, receive a Statement of Achievement.

GAS – EAP LEVEL 4: ADVANCED PLUS

Focus on English for academic purposes, using integrated curriculum while studying credit courses. Upon successful completion, receive an Ontario College Certificate.

Strong English skills are the foundation for your academic and career success. St. Lawrence College provides two English learning programs with a total of four levels. Applicants may start at different levels, based on proficiency. The programs offer an enriching English experience with authentic readings, audio and video segments, activities and exercises designed to build vocabulary, text comprehension and pronunciation. There will also be opportunities to learn about Canadian culture through meaningful experiences in the community, including field trips to various historical and cultural sites.

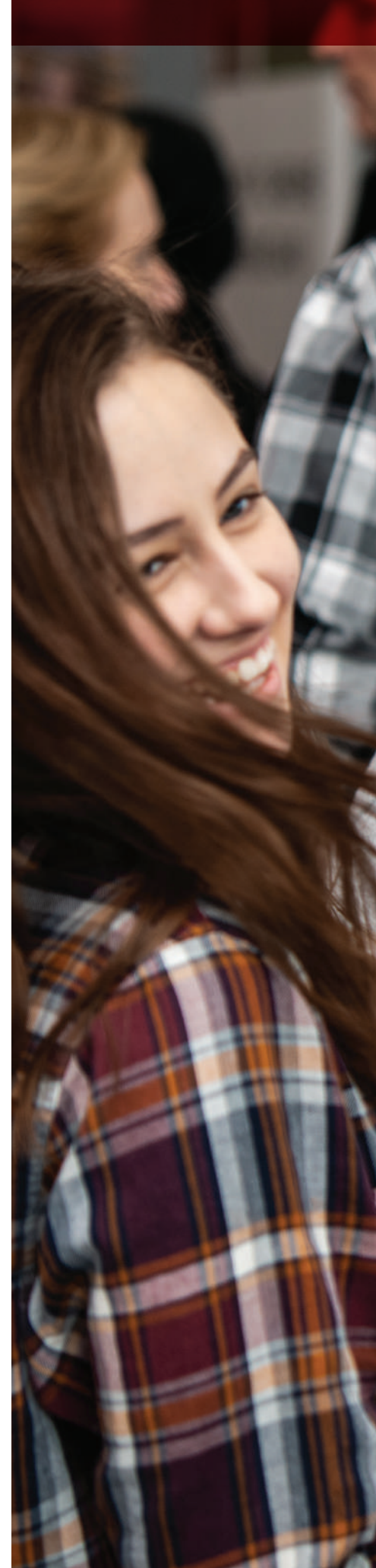

PLACEMENT

You will take a mandatory placement test to determine your level once you arrive in Canada. No prior testing is required to register in the English as a Second Language Pre-Academic (ESL) or General Arts and Science - English for Academic Purposes (GAS-EAP) (details on page 13). However, if you have done an international English test, your score will be used for placement. Please provide the test score with your application. The table below lists the entrance requirement for each level. To estimate your level go to the self-assessment tool at learnatslc.com/esl.

ONE-YEAR CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS

APPLIED ARTS

General Arts & Science Certificate - General Studies Stream

Explore your interests and prepare for the workforce by developing a set of core employment skills in courses tailored to your preference or prepare yourself for future post-secondary study in this one-year certificate program. (Code: 0478)

Media Arts Fundamentals

Explore the exciting variety of disciplines and careers in media, design, and the arts. A variety of media arts electives allow students to earn credits toward specialized two- and three-year diploma programs in Graphic Design, Visual & Creative Arts – Fine Arts, Music and Digital Media, Advertising and Marketing Communications, and General Arts and Science. (Code: 0981)

BUSINESS

Business Fundamentals

This program serves as the first year for the Business Core diplomas—Business, Accounting, Human Resources, and Marketing—and graduates can choose to pursue one of these diplomas or use their Business Fundamentals certificate as a foundation for other programs of study or their career. (Code: 0973)

Office Administration - General

Gain competitive and marketable skills related to office employment by studying communications, office procedures, a variety of computer applications and bookkeeping. Includes work placement. (Code: 0620)

COMMUNITY SERVICES

General Arts & Science Certificate - Social Sciences Stream

This program provides foundational knowledge that is directly transferable to programs such as Social Service Worker and Child and Youth Care. If interested in other programs upon completion, contact the General Arts and Science program coordinator for additional course requirements. (Code: 0478SS)

Pre-Service Firefighter Education & Training

Following the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1001 Firefighter I & II standard, NFPA 1072, NFPA 1035 and NFPA 1006 (Chapter 5) this program blends theory, lab practice, and field experience. Students will be expected to perform fire related duties at a considerable height or in very confined spaces to prepare for entry into the firefighting profession. A firefighter training tower on campus provides the opportunity to gain practical skills. (Code: 1011)

COMPUTER AND ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGY

General Arts & Science Certificate - Technology Stream

The courses in this one-year program provide the foundation required for engineering technology programs. Ideal for students who wish to move on to applied computing programs. (Code: 0478TE)

HEALTH AND SCIENCE

Medical Laboratory Assistant/Technician ✓

Important members of the health care team, they interact directly with patients, and perform ECG's and collect blood samples for laboratory analysis. Inside the lab they assist other professionals by sorting and preparing samples for testing, operating lab equipment, performing basic lab testing, under supervision, and managing data in computers. This program includes two semesters of in-class/lab learning followed by 4 weeks of field placement. Graduates are qualified to write the Medical Laboratory Professionals' Association of Ontario (MLPAO) and the Canadian Society for Medical Laboratory Science (CSMLS) certification exams. (Code: 0734)

Personal Support Worker ✓

PSW certificate graduates provide valuable support services to individuals and their families in a wide variety of health care settings. Students learn the theory behind care, practice in two lab settings (hospital and a community apartment simulation) and apply the skills learned in four different clinical field placements. (Code: 1032)

Pre-Health Sciences Pathway to Advanced Diplomas and Degrees

This program provides the academic background for admission to advanced diploma and baccalaureate programs in health sciences. Qualified graduates may pursue a Bachelor of Health Sciences (Honours) at Queen's University and will receive credit for four courses (12 units) toward the degree. (Code: 1094)

Pre-Health Sciences Pathway to Certificates and Diplomas

The one-year certificate program prepares individuals for successful admission in certificate and diploma-level Health Sciences programs and other post-secondary studies. (Code: 1093)

SKILLED TRADES

Culinary Skills

Students learn entry-level aspects of food production, basic nutrition, kitchen management, and fundamental food and labour controls. Students who successfully complete this program are eligible to return to the second year of the Culinary Management program if they choose. (Code: 1004)

General Arts & Science Certificate - Pre-Trades Stream

Are you interested in the Skilled Trades, but not sure which one to choose? This foundational one-year program will help you explore a variety of skilled trades while you also build broad skills that apply to the workplace. This program focuses on Bricklaying/Masonry, Plumbing, Electrical, Carpentry, and Mechanical trades. (Code: 0478RD)

General Construction Carpentry Techniques

This program allows you to build a new structure or renovate an old one. Emphasis on carpentry skills from base footings to framing, interior and exterior finishing, and fine finishing techniques. Building and installation techniques taught through hands-on construction activities. (Code: 1071)

TWO-YEAR DIPLOMA PROGRAMS

APPLIED ARTS

Fine Arts: Visual & Creative Arts

Showcase your artwork and polish your curatorial practices in one of four exhibition spaces on campus, that includes a graduate exhibition in the Marianne van Silfhout Gallery. Combine theory and studio practices in a variety of areas within visual arts such as art history, painting, drawing, mixed media, printmaking, digital photography, business of art, and more. (Code: 1038)

General Arts and Science Diploma

Engage a broad spectrum of liberal arts foundational learning in this multidisciplinary program. Prepare for the workforce or further post-secondary studies. Transfer options are available to graduates. (Code: 0550)

Music & Digital Media

Using an integrated arts approach, MDM connects music to other artistic disciplines, enhancing students' development as musicians and as flexible professionals in the arts. Throughout the program, students study their primary instrument/voice and participate in a variety of ensembles. In second year, students gain experience in composition, entrepreneurial skills, and integrated arts project work. (Code: 0965)

BUSINESS

Advertising and Marketing Communications

Enter the exciting world of advertising. Learn how to create ads and online content and prepare campaigns for real clients. This hands-on program offers a field placement and acutting-edge Apple computer labs to ensure students have the skills they need to work in advertising. (Code: 0263)

Business

Business students at St. Lawrence College become effective leaders and communicators, able to represent themselves and their work through interviews and resumes, networking opportunities, and presentations. Students apply problem solving, teamwork, and intercultural skills to projects at the college, in the community, and internationally, establishing themselves as global business citizens. (Code: 0295)

Business - Accounting

This program studies business fundamentals with a focus on accounting and finance, including financial and cost accounting, taxation, and accounting software applications. (Code: 0259)

Business - Human Resources

Combine the study of business fundamentals, including accounting, finance, marketing, and communications, with a focus on human resources. Courses provide credits toward the Certified Human Resources Professional (CHRP) designation (Code: 0264)

Business - Marketing

Create value for the marketplace through applied courses, including integrated marketing communications, brand management, business simulations, data analysis, personal selling, marketing research and entrepreneurship. Take part in Emotional Intelligence and Workplace Big Five assessments. Sharpen your skills and make important connections with the Professional Development Competition, Toastmasters, Sales

Competitions, Enactus SLC, industry certifications and hands-on learning with leading industry tools. A marketing placement will let you contribute to an organization and be career-ready. (Code: 0261)

Office Administration - Health Services

In addition to studying general areas of office administration, students become familiar with medical terminology and the production of medical documents encountered in the health services field. Includes work placement. (Code: 0986)

Office Administration - Legal

In addition to studying general areas of office administration, students become familiar with office procedures relating to the production of legal documents and specialized legal software programs. Includes work placement. (Code: 0621)

Office Administration - Legal/Health Services

In addition to studying general areas of office administration, students gain specialized knowledge and skill in legal and health services office administration, preparing them to work in a variety of settings. Includes work placement. (Code: 0824)

COMPUTER AND ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGY

Computer Systems Technician

Receive hands-on training in computer hardware, applied internet technology, software installation, scripting procedures, diagnostics, network installation, operating systems, maintenance, user support, and website development. Includes work placement. (Code: 0457)

Energy Systems Engineering Technician

Develop and implement projects for businesses and homeowners to realize energy savings in their buildings and understand systems specification, installations, and operations in the fields of renewable energy, and conventional heating, ventilation, air conditioning, air handling and control technologies. The program has two learning facilities: Energy House, an off-grid training facility, and RE Lab, a grid-connected laboratory. Both offer a selection of renewable energy and existing conventional heating systems for hands-on training opportunities. (Code: 1002)

Game - Programming

Bridge your passion for gaming and career goals and acquire game development skills with a solid foundation in software design methodology and programming. (Code: 0974)

Instrumentation and Control Engineering Technician

Gain skills in instrumentation, robotics, process control, programmable logic controllers, and more in this hands-on program, with a 2:1 ratio of lab hours to theory hours in core subjects. (Code: 0731)

Wind Turbine Technician

Gain in-depth knowledge and practical experience of the electrical and mechanical aspects of wind turbines, learn fibreglass repair techniques, and receive safety training for working at heights or confined spaces. Learn to install, carry out preventative maintenance, and diagnose and repair any faults, contributing to the on-going safe operation of wind turbines. (Code: 1046)

COMMUNITY SERVICES

Early Childhood Education

Work with children (from birth to age 12) and their families in a variety of early childhood settings. Graduates understand human development and can use this to create responsive, inclusive, play-based learning environments to best support the child as they develop. Students receive 630-hours of practical experience in a variety of early learning environments during three field placements, starting in the first year of the program. This allows students to apply the skills taught in the classroom in real world learning experiences. (Code: 0302)

Mental Wellness and Addictions Worker ✓

Be prepared with specialized training in addictions and mental health. You will acquire the skills required by frontline professionals to deliver responsive and effective practice in the healthcare and social services field. You will gain an understanding of the complex needs of diverse client populations; nurture and expand your critical-thinking and problem-solving skills; and, recognize, understand, and apply a holistic model of client-centered care. The in-class hands-on approach to learning is key to student success, translating theory-to-practice during the field placement practicum. (Code: 0865)

HEALTH AND SCIENCE

Environmental Technician ✓

Students develop skills such as data collection and analysis and environmental assessment supported by two field courses and a four-week work placement. Students also benefit from a partnership with the St. Lawrence River Institute of Environmental Sciences, a globally-recognized centre for scientific research on the St. Lawrence River located on the Cornwall campus. (Code: 0964)

Fitness & Health Promotion ✓

Become a dynamic leader in the field of fitness health and promotion by studying exercise science, human relations, fitness, personal and professional development, health promotion, and business management. Gain 400 hours of practical experience in the work force from two work placements. (Code: 0442)

Health Information Management ✓

HIM professionals work with personal health records, capturing and encoding patient information, analyzing data, upholding patient privacy and preparing statistical reports for use in health care delivery, research, and education. (Code: 1008)

HOSPITALITY

Culinary Management

Aspiring professional chefs wanted! Achieve higher levels of employment in the culinary industry with culinary techniques, vegetarian and international cooking and bakery, business communications, management practices, nutrition, menu planning and development, and applied computer skills. (Code: 1003)

Hospitality ✓

Whether you dream of working abroad, or prefer to remain closer to home, the Hospitality Program will prepare you to launch a dynamic and rewarding career in the diverse and exciting Hospitality Industry. (Code: 0903)

Tourism ✓

Do you want to be a part of the fastest growing industry in the world? Study special events planning and management, casino operations, hospitality and tourism law, sport tourism, adventure and ecotourism, arts and cultural tourism, and historical tourism. (Code: 0879)

JUSTICE STUDIES

Community and Justice Services

Develop skills in problem solving, critical and creative thinking, and teamwork. You will be engaged in the process of creating and building safer communities by intervening with offenders, high-risk client groups, developing community programs and other initiatives that require measured and appropriate interventions. Field placements cover the entire range of correctional, social service, and educational agencies. (Code: 0335)

Law Clerk

Obtain a solid foundation in legal procedures and substantive law applicable to authorized areas of work for law clerks, who work independently under the general supervision of a lawyer. Emphasis is placed on property law, wills and estates, legal research and writing, and business law. Students become familiar with office procedures relating to the production of legal documents and specialized legal software programs. The program includes a four-week work placement. (Code: 0228)

Police Foundations

Study the Canadian criminal justice system, criminal and civil law, community mobilization and community policing, fitness and lifestyle management, sociology, psychology and more. (Code: 0817)

SKILLED TRADES

Electrical Engineering Technician ✓

Gain well-rounded practical and theoretical knowledge of many aspects of the electrical field. This program also covers all the curriculum learning outcomes for the trade of Construction and Maintenance Electrician and Industrial Electrician (Code: 1050)

Esthetician (38 Weeks) ✓

This 10-month program will teach you the latest treatments and techniques in the spa industry, including basic, advanced and medical esthetics. Gain valuable experience by practicing your skills at Dynamic Designs, the training salon on campus. You will be trained in Thai stem massage, bamboo massage, hot lava shell massage, lash lifting, lash extensions. In the last ten years, our students have won ten gold medals at the provincial skills competition. At the national skills competition they've won seven gold, two silver and one bronze. We also participated in two world competitions, in Brazil and Abu Dhabi. (Code: 0736)

Hairstyling (49 Weeks) ✓

Can you make the cut? Be career ready through this Fast-Track Diploma program completed in under 1 year. Students benefit from a combination of theory and practical, hands-on experience with clients in both the Dynamic Designs Training Salon and through experiential learning field placements. In addition, graduates gain a certificate of achievement for advanced design through the Toronto Redken Exchange. (Code:0503)

Mechanical Technician

Develop an industry-based mechanical/millwright skill set. Spend 50% of each week in a hands-on mechanical lab setting, using metal lathes, milling machines, surface grinders, Computer Numerical Control, Additive Manufacturing Technologies, power tools and welding-related machinery. Study a variety of technical subjects including lean manufacturing, AutoCad, technical math, communications and more. (Code: 0507)

Motive Power Technician

This program provides students with a specific range of technical training as well as a range of generic skills required for employment in this rapidly changing industry. Acquire hands-on experience through a variety of shop classes and a Technology and Business Practices course in which students work on vehicles in a simulated automotive shop setting. (Code: 1030)

Welding & Fabrication Technician

Study a variety of welding processes including Shielded Metal Arc Welding, Gas Metal Arc Welding, and Gas Tungsten Arc Welding. Program content also includes blueprint reading, safety and rigging, computer aided design, layout and fitting, and more. Students take a Computer-Aided Design (CAD) course and operate automated welding and cutting equipment giving them the opportunity to operate CAD equipment in an advanced fabricating shop. (Code: 1040/1063)

THREE-YEAR ADVANCED DIPLOMA PROGRAMS

APPLIED ARTS

Graphic Design ✓

Become a visual communicator and creative problem solver. Learn how to make information visually appealing and meaningful by studying core design principles and their application to emerging technologies and interactive media applications. Apply real world learning experiences by working with external clients, producing a comprehensive design portfolio and completing a final capstone project and field placement. (Code: 0309)

Music Theatre - Performance

Develop your skills as a music theatre performer by studying a combination of dance, music and acting. Students will perform in a variety of music theatre productions with industry guest artists to develop their professional skills. Courses include integration of skills, one on one mentoring and rehearsals for simulated professional experiences. (Code: 1012)

BUSINESS

Advertising and Marketing Communications Management ✓

Study the full breadth of marketing communications including advertising planning, direct marketing, event planning, public relations, video-production, social media, web marketing, and more. This program offers two work placements and a wide range of experiential learning opportunities, designed to get grads job-ready. (Code: 0763)

Business Administration ✓

Students gain a broad and in-depth knowledge of the key functional areas of business. Areas of study include entrepreneurship, international business, project management, business operations and supply chain management. In the final semester, students benefit from the practical experience gained during a work placement. (Code: 0293)

Business Administration - Accounting ✓

Obtain a well-rounded, career-ready background in accounting. Gain intensive experience in financial and cost accounting, corporate finance, auditing, and taxation. Become current in using job-related IT solutions, including Excel, tax software, and accounting software. The final year includes case-based learning from professional situations. A work placement in the final semester provides key practical experience to broaden your professional network. Numerous post-graduation opportunities are available for further education. (Code: 0659)

Business Administration - Marketing ✓

Create value for the marketplace with marketing skills through applied courses, including integrated marketing communications, brand management, business simulations, data analysis, personal selling, marketing research and entrepreneurship. Take part in Emotional Intelligence and WorkPlace Big Five assessments. Sharpen your skills and make important connections with the Professional Development Competition, Toastmasters, Sales Competitions, Enactus SLC, industry certifications and hands-on learning with leading industry tools. Be career ready and contribute to an organization with a marketing placement. (Code: 0209)

Business Administration - Human Resources ✓

In addition to business fundamentals, students gain extensive knowledge in human resources. Courses provide credits toward the Certified Human Resources Professional (CHRP) designation. Students gain practical experience during a work placement in the final semester. (Code: 0606)

Business Administration - Human Resources (Fast-Track) ✓

This program provides training to those seeking employment in the human resources profession or to those currently working in the field who wish to upgrade their training and gain professional accreditation. Courses provide credits toward the Certified Human Resources Professional (CHRP) designation. Students gain practical experience during a work placement in the final semester. (Code: 0971)

COMMUNITY SERVICES

Child and Youth Care ✓

Learn to facilitate change in children, youth and young adults who are experiencing a range of social, emotional and/or behavioural challenges. Students gain practical experience during four field placements. (Code: 0301)

COMPUTER AND ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGY

Civil Engineering Technology ✓

Civil engineering technologists are involved in everything we do from the planning, design, construction, maintenance, environmental management, land use planning, fluid and soil mechanics, steel structures, highway technology, and more. Includes a month-long field placement. (Code: 0104)

Computer Programming and Analysis ✓

Gain skills in designing and writing computer programs, web development, client server, logic analysis, operating systems, object-oriented programming, online gaming, mobile computing— Android cell phones, Microsoft.net, and more. Our program offers mainframe training through a partnership with IBM's academic initiative program. Includes work placement. (Code: 0458)

Energy Systems Engineering Technology ✓

Building on the skills developed during the first two years, graduates will assist developers, designers, architectural, construction, and sustainable energy companies to incorporate energy efficiency and renewable energy technologies into their projects and have an in-depth understanding of system design. Includes a 4-week placement. (Code: 1001)

Instrumentation and Control Engineering Technology ✓

Building on the skill set of the Instrumentation and Control Technician, this program provides advanced knowledge in process control, robotic and automation systems, computer interfacing and communications, and power systems. Includes work placement. (Code: 0730)

HEALTH AND SCIENCE

Biotechnology Advanced ✓

Gain expertise and practical training in all aspects of Biotechnology including molecular and microbiology, immunology, chemistry, fermentation and protein techniques, environmental remediation, food science, applied genetics, plant biotechnology, analytical instrumentation, and tissue culture. User Experience Design (2 semesters)

Consult with target audiences (users) to create technology, products and services that meet their needs, are functional and pleasurable to use, and meet the strategic objectives of businesses and organizations. UX design is a fast-growing field that encompasses many disciplines. Individuals studying UX come from a wide variety of backgrounds including: graphic design and interaction design, business, marketing, communication, psychology, and computer science. (Code: 1103)

BUSINESS

Business Analytics (3 semesters)

Business Analytics - International Stream (4 semesters)

Be prepared to work in the growing and dynamic field of business analytics. Learn the techniques and tools of analytical decision making and utilize these skills to drive competitiveness of an organization. Students will be exposed to generic analytics modeling as well as courses in the areas of marketing, operations, and business strategy. Students will also be introduced to machine learning and artificial intelligence concepts, and, how to use supervised and unsupervised learning techniques to solve real world problems through applied learning and a work placement. (Code: 0887/0847)

Digital Marketing Communications (2 semesters)

This program focuses on strategy development, an area where there is a shortage of trained professionals. It will deepen your marketing communications knowledge and develop new skills in planning and implementing DMC campaigns. You will learn how to utilize digital tools to develop customer-focused marketing programs, as well as digital analytics to predict and measure the success of web, digital, social media, and CRM campaigns. Gain hands-on experience through a marketing agency model, solving challenges for real clients, followed by a six-week work placement. (Code: 1089)

Health Care Administration International (4 semesters)

This is a business program that provides post-secondary graduates with business and leadership fundamentals. It is geared toward international students who have previous education and work experience in health care who wish to develop their managerial and leadership skills. It is a program designed to transition students to learning in Canada, become familiar with the Canadian health care system, and make international students' career ready. Students receive a wide base of business skills in a health care context such as financial, communication, human resources, leadership, operations, and critical thinking. (Code: 0987)

Project Management (2 semesters)

This program prepares graduates for a rewarding managerial career in Project Management, a highly sought discipline that involves the application of knowledge, skills and techniques to execute projects effectively and efficiently. Project managers are in high demand across all industries. As part of the tuition, all students are enrolled in the Project Management Institute (PMI) as student members to the Ottawa Valley Chapter. (Code 0897)

Supply Chain Management (2 semesters)

This program builds on the student's previous education and work experience and introduces all facets of supply chain management and logistics from a theoretical and practical perspective. Students benefit from an integrated field placement during semester two. (Code: 0848)

COMMUNITY SERVICES

Autism & Behavioural Science (2 semesters)

In this intensive, highly specialized program, students learn to use a variety of evidence-based approaches to develop skills of those with Autism Spectrum Disorder by reviewing relevant literature, developing intervention plans, implementing behaviour change programs, facilitating group programming, and more. Emphasis is on understanding Applied Behaviour Analysis and its use in the treatment of Autism Spectrum Disorder. Two field placements give students 350-hours of practical experience in this program. (Code: 1027)

Therapeutic Recreation (3 semesters)


This program prepares students with specialized training to work within recreation, health, or social service delivery systems serving individuals of all ages and abilities. Acquire skills to complete client assessments, develop and evaluate programs, and use a variety of facilitative techniques to enhance health, improve functional ability, and increase individual's quality of life. The curriculum for this program is in alignment with the Therapeutic Recreation Ontario (TRO) Essential Competency Framework (ECF). (Code: 0988)

English as a Second Language Pre-Academic (14 weeks per level)

Learn English language and develop speaking, listening, reading and writing skills, and study Canadian culture through field trips to culturally/historically significant sites. 2 levels – Pre-Intermediate and Intermediate. (Code: 0394)
